## RAMBLINGS from the Rev...

Two minor encounters in the last few weeks have set me wondering. One was an interview with a woman passenger on the Carnival ship that was stranded at sea. The conditions on board were terrible; limited food, no air conditioning, few toilets and sewage often on the floors of cabins. But this woman was crying, tears on her cheeks, as she said how awful and frightening it was to be without cell phone



contact for three days. What? I almost laughed, but then had to wonder what we are becoming. How will children growing up today be prepared to deal with real disaster or trauma?

The other encounter was vastly different. In the recent issue of Sojourners Magazine there was an article on the civil war going on in the Democratic Republic of the Congo, where 6 million people have been killed since the war began. Six million! That's comparable to the Holocaust, yet we hear almost nothing about it. What must life be like for the people who live there? Rape and murder are commonplace and there is no justice, or what justice there is is corrupt. What will become of all the children growing up there?

One thing is clear. Whether in Bunia, Africa or Newtown, Connecticut or in Afghanistan, violence is ruining people's lives. And it also creates the terrorists of tomorrow when commerce and infrastructure are destroyed as well. Violence always generates more violence just as revenge begets more revenge. The only cure is for someone to break the vicious cycle with non-violent responses.

I hope you will all re-read the Sermon on the Mount in the Gospel of Matthew during this Lenten season. The opening lines are the Beatitudes, but there is much more there too. Instead of an eye for an eye, Jesus tells us to be reconciled, to turn the other cheek, and to love our enemies. Tough lessons, but ones I hope you will mull over in the light of your own experience.

As we will see during Holy Week violence came to Jesus too, but he responded differently. He accepted the violence done to him, and his insistence that his followers do the same saved them from a similar fate. Had the disciples threatened a violent reaction the Romans would have rounded them up and crucified them too. Instead, they lived on to spread the Christian Gospel throughout the Mediterranean world. While it's sadly true that our churches have often forgotten that Jesus preached non-violence, we do not have to do the same. The way of the world, the way of great earthly powers, is not the same as the way of life in the Kingdom of God.

I find myself ruminating on this a lot lately and trying to imagine life lived in peace, with compassion and justice for all people. It could become a reality, but only if we are willing to do the work to change ourselves and create a beloved community in which others can join us.

May this Lent and Easter season be a time of growth and transformation for each and every one of us. Blessings and joy,
